President, Cathy Swindall, welcomed the group, opened with a prayer, and led the group in reciting the **UMW Purpose**.

Brenda called our attention to the **Prayer Calendar**, and we observed the March 2 birthdays of missionary Joel Ncahouri in Cameroon and Isabel Scott, on staff in Atlanta. The **Mission Focus** was the Global Health Action of the United States which is building the capacity of China's National Health Commission to develop policies and practices to support quality daycare services for children ages 0-3.

The *Response* Moment shared by Brenda W. described the "Books for Babies" program of the Morris, Illinois UMW. They have collected hundreds of books which are donated to the local maternity hospital. The family of each baby born there receives a book with the group's best wishes and contact information enclosed. Brenda thought we might want to consider doing something similar in the future for the babies of the addicted mommies served by Laura Plaster's Wheels of C.A.R.E. program.

For the **Devotion,** Angela shared an intriguing personal story about an angel sent in the form of a dog to protect her and her young children while Dale was away.

Minutes of the February 2020 meeting were approved as presented on a motion made by Brenda W. and seconded by Vickie. One member's name was omitted from those attending, and that has been corrected.

The February 2021 **Treasurer's Report** was summarized by Cathy. Opening balance was \$2,491.54 with receipts of \$1,416.43 and spendings of \$770.00, leaving a balance of \$3,137.97 going forward into March.

Correspondence – Jeannette will be sending a birthday card and \$20 to 5 of our college students between now and April. Kathy W. wanted us to be aware that Jeannette is buying the cards herself and said she will be helping her do that in the future.

Program

Tracey Farmer visited to share the story of how she and her husband Brad were led to their leadership and ministry positions at Faith in Action. It was clear that God had been preparing Brad through several jobs and his education through the years to be ready at just the right time to step into the

leadership role of this mission outreach serving those living in poverty or having a crisis situation. Three years ago, as Larry Bays was searching for a replacement for himself as director, and Brad and Tracey were praying for more time to spend with their family and in ministry; circumstances brought them together while planning a motorcycle fundraiser for Faith in Action. Larry immediately felt God had sent Brad to take his place and asked him to prayerfully consider it. As Brad and Tracey asked God to open the door if it was His will, they stepped through and have been busily immersed in the ministries of Faith in Action ever since.

We learned that Faith in Action is a mission outreach serving those living in poverty or in a financial crisis situation in Abingdon and Washington County. It is supported by 40 local churches, private donations, USDA, and local grocery stores. It has served up to 800 families a month through the Stone Soup Food Pantry, the New Life Thrift Shop, and Crossroads Medical Mission. It also provides financial crisis assistance for families who have lost jobs. Operating on the foundation of the Greatest Commandments revealed by Jesus in Matthew 22:35-40, it welcomes volunteers and the support of the community. We are invited to join in loving God by loving our neighbors in need through the ministries of Faith in Action.
